Dear Dean Lowe,

The Graduate Student Union's Constitution has been ratified in a referendum which was put to the Graduate student population of Princeton University. (97% of the 997 students who voted were in favour of the adoption of the proposed Constitution.) Elections to the Graduate Student Union's Assembly will take place by the end of April 1989, and the first meeting of that Assembly is planned for early May, 1989.

Given the demonstrated support which the GSU has, and given the need for efficient communication in an organisation of this sort, it is both clear that the GSU needs, and reasonable that the GSU would like to have, an office on campus. We realise that it is difficult to find office space on campus, but we also have reason to believe that there will be some reallocation of office space before the beginning of the new academic year. Moreover, we feel that there are strong grounds for claiming that this GSU request should be given the highest priority if there is office space which can be reassigned. Of course, if an office could be made available to the GSU by the end of April 1989, or at some time over the summer, we would be extremely happy.
